Old Business: __Iutta mentioned she contacted Kitty O'Keefe, Administrative & Outreach Coordinator with the OUNC regarding the need for our Council to continue to file the required IRS Form 990-N as well as the Oregon Dept of Justice (DOJ) Form CT-12 and the Secretary of State (SOS) Corporate Division annual reports since they have hired Wicks Emmett to file these yearly for other local councils, and they deduct fees for this annually from our OUCC assistance funds. She replied that we had stated previously we prefer to file our own; however, if we wish to change this they would need confirmation from our Council. Therefore, Jutta requested the members present vote on giving this task to OUCC and Wicks Emmett. Doug questioned what they will charge our Council? Jutta stated they already deduct a fee from our annual assistance funds and didn't believe there would be any other charge to our Council. Jeff made a motion to have Wicks Emmett file the annual IRS form 990-N, DOJ CT-12 and the SOS reports starting with 2021 and effective each year hereafter; Doug seconded the motion and it was approved unanimously by the members present.
